12:00pm-3:00pm

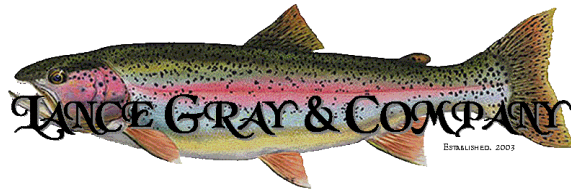
